
Common Final Exam (CFE)





Practical Experience

- 30 months of paid qualifying experience required to get a CPA designation
- Show progressive responsibility
- Demonstrate adequate technical competency development
- Record experience in PERT



PPR and EVR

Pre-Approved Program Route (PPR)	Experience Verification Route (EVR)
Structured to meet all Practical Experience requirements after 30 months	Candidate is responsible for ensuring requirements are met
Streamlined experience reporting	More detailed reporting required
