Duties/Responsibilities

The CPA Education Foundation has two fundamental purposes. The first is to help grow the CPA profession in Alberta by supporting accounting and business education and encouraging qualified individuals to pursue careers in accounting, and the second is to represent the expertise and integrity of the profession in the community. The Foundation is incorporated under the *Societies Act (Alberta)* and is a registered charity under the *Income Tax Act (Canada)*. The board holds ultimate responsibility in meeting the Foundation's requirements under these Acts.
